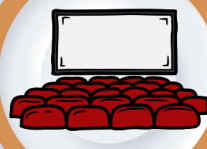
## First ever LGBT+ Film

The Dickson Experimental Sound Film showed 2 men dancing together which shocked audiences



1894

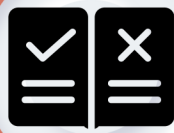
1912 - 1930

## The Hay's Code

This list of rules for films banned certain "immoral" themes including "sex perversion" - LGBT people and relationships

## Queer Coding in films

LGBT+ people were taboo so any instances of queerness in film had to be carefully coded in subtext and character traits only

## The Hay's Code is lifted

The code stopped being enforced as strictly towards it's later years and was lifted in 1968 to make way for the age classification system

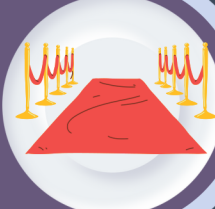


## The Boys in the Band

One of the first LGBT+ films to be made after the Hay's code is lifted. This film focused on a friendship group of gay men

## Dog Day Afternoon

Chris Saradon played a transwoman + was nominated for an Oscar. This was based on a true life story of a man robbing a bank to pay for his partner's gender affirming surgery

## Philadelphia

Tom Hanks won an Oscar for playing a Gay man fired for having AIDs. This started to shift the idea that playing LGBT+ characters would end careers

## Ian McKellen

Ian McKellen was the first Out Gay man to be nominated for an award playing a Gay man in "Gods and Monsters"

There was an increase in LGBT+ themes and characters, and nominations and awards gained including for films like "Boys Don't Cry" & "Brokeback Mountain"

## Moonlight wins Oscar!

Moonlight made history as the first LGBT+ film to win an Oscar. It was also the first film with an all black cast to win an Oscar making it a milestone of an award!

## Year of Representation
