Shared Lives South West was honoured to welcome representatives from Baroness Casey's Independent Commission on Adult Social Care to its Devon office. It is the first care organisation to host the Casey Commission as part of their national review into adult social care.

The commission, appointed by the UK Government, is undertaking a comprehensive review of the adult social care system. It aims to develop clear and actionable recommendations to ensure that the system is fit to meet both current and future needs. As part of their work, the team will be speaking to people who draw on care and support, their families, care staff, local authorities, and both public and third-sector organisations. During their visit, the commission met with Shared Lives South West staff. commissioning leads from **Devon County Council and** Cornwall Council, and Shared Lives Carers who shared firsthand insights into daily life in a Shared Lives household. The afternoon included visits to local households where Shared Lives care takes place, offering the team a deeper understanding of the model in practice.

"We welcome the review the Casey Commission is undertaking and feel proud to be involved in this important work," said Dominic Spayne, CEO of Shared Lives South West.

"Throughout the visit, the team gained valuable insight into how Shared Lives works, the many benefits of this unique care model, the challenges we face, and the changes we'd like to see in the sector. This review is a significant moment for adult social care, and we'll be watching closely as the next steps unfold."

Back then, we were called SWAPS," she recalled. Over the years, Sally's caseload has been based in Mid and North Devon, with some households remaining as part of her caseload since the very beginning.

"I've loved the stability of my role and witnessing the ups and downs of everyday life," she said.

"In previous social work roles, I often felt like I was just fire-fighting, but here, I've been able to build long-term relationships," she said.
Sally will greatly miss her chats with households, the banter in



the office, and the social meals with colleagues.

"Shared Lives is an effective organisation that does social care work well—most importantly, people are at the heart of it all," she added. Now, as she embarks on retirement—her 'holiday life'—Sally is embracing new adventures.

"I started writing stories last year and now attend monthly writing sessions. After years of report writing in my role, I've found joy in creative writing. I also hope to travel and go backpacking," she shared. Over the last couple of months, she's ensured she saw all the households on her caseload and made a real effort to say goodbye to the whole team. The staff team held a shared lunch for Sally in the Devon office and presented her with gifts and flowers.



"Gavin stayed with us for a long weekend and enjoyed a great walk on Dartmoor," said Shared Lives Carer Caroline O'Sullivan.








We had a staff team day at Buckfast Abbey in June. Our focus was on the psychometric Insights Discovery profile system. It was great to see everyone!

Seen here are Colin, Josh and David, who all went to Turkey for the first time, with their Shared Lives Carer Maggie Byrne.


